Bobbie Athey is the retired Chief Health & Safety Officer for MTA Bridges & Tunnels, one of the Metropolitan Transportation Authority's operating agencies in New York State. Her responsibilities included safety, health and environmental programs for approximately 1800 employees, operating seven bridges and two tunnels in metropolitan New York City. The agency is the largest electronic toll collection agency in the world, operating and maintaining crossings, as well as contractor safety for a \$1.2B capital program. In her twenty plus years working in the safety field she always focused on prevention as the key to improving organizational safety. Mrs. Athey holds bachelor and master degrees from The University of Texas-Dallas, in Urban Planning and Environmental Engineering.
