Mr. Kulick is a native of Carteret, New Jersey and graduated from Cook College, Rutgers University, where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in Environmental Health. He also maintains a Health Inspector's License for the State of New Jersey.

Mr. Kulick has been employed by the U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), since September of 1977. He initially served as an industrial hygiene field compliance officer for six years. He also held various other positions within OSHA such as Training Officer, Grants Officer, Federal Agency Program Manager, Consultation Program Manager, and Chief of Internal Audits.

In 1987, Mr. Kulick was appointed to the position of Assistant Regional Administrator for Federal and State Operations in OSHA Region II, in which he coordinated enforcement efforts for Region II comprised of New York, New Jersey, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.

In April 1989, Mr. Kulick was appointed as the Area Director for OSHA's Parsippany Area Office. While serving as the Area Director for Parsippany, the office received three of Vice President Gore's Hammer Awards for successful innovations in Reinventing the Federal government.

In 1997, Mr. Kulick served one year in OSHA's National Office headquarters in Washington, D.C. directing and coordinating OSHA's field Redesign effort as well as OSHA's overall organizational change effort. In 1998, he held the position of Special Assistant to the Deputy Assistant Secretary for Enforcement.

In August of 1998, Mr. Kulick was appointed as the Area Director for the Manhattan Area Office with responsibility for the boroughs of Manhattan and Brooklyn.

In June of 2000, Mr. Kulick served as the Area Director for OSHA's Avenel NJ Area Office. In that capacity he was responsible for Warren, Hunterdon, and Somerset, Middlesex and Union counties in New Jersey, as well as Staten Island, N.Y.

Mr. Kulick served on a temporary basis as the Regional Administrator for Region 2, Deputy Regional Administrator for Region 2, Deputy Regional Administrator for Region 1, and Deputy Director, Office of Policy and Planning in Washington, D.C.

In July of 2008, Mr. Kulick was officially appointed as the Regional Administrator for OSHA Region II. Region II has jurisdiction over New York, New Jersey, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands. As Regional Administrator, Mr. Kulick is responsible for the direction, management and control of programs and goals set forth in the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970. He serves as the Agency's principal point of contact for management and labor in the private and public sectors.

Mr. Kulick worked on the Hurricane Katrina Response in Louisiana. He also worked extensively on OSHA's response to the World Trade Center disaster at both the New York City and the Staten Island Landfill sites. Mr. Kulick is trained to ICS 400/402 and NIMS 700/800 level.

Mr. Kulick has attended more than twenty technical and management training classes. He has also received eight Secretary of Labor Exceptional Achievement Awards, one Meritorious Achievement Award and one Distinguished Career Service Award.
