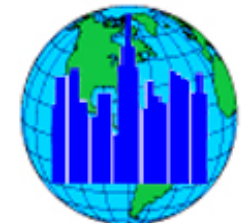

Research in the area of road safety has been un-
dertaken since the early years of the Research
Institute. In the first decades, the research fo-
cus was vehicle crashworthiness, but this has
shifted to crash avoidance research in the 80s.
Current research is devoted to understanding
driver distraction with a view towards identify-
ing strategies to mitigate the potential nega-
tive consequences associated with on board
telematics. A second area of research interest,
particularly in the sphere of commercial driving,
is the measurement and management of safety
climate. The presentation will provide a brief
overview of the Research Institute’s mission and
scope of research and provide specific descrip-
tions of current research priorities in the area
of road safety.

Recommendations for business continuity plan- ning often include strategies for the stockpiling of personal protective equipment (PPE) during an event and in the aftermath following. Homeland Security Presidential Directive 7 (HSPD-7) has designated 18 industries as part of the Critical Infrastructure and Key Resources (CIKR) which have been given a higher burden for prepared- ness, but today’s economy often makes it chal- lenging to stockpile the amount of PPE needed for an event. Examples of business continuity plans will be reviewed including recommendations for PPE stockpiling. We will also discuss other fac- tors which should be considered when making determinations regarding types and quantities of PPE.
